Description

At the end of the test, clicking 'Save file' opens the XML file or (in older versions of Safari?) an illegible and useless blob of text. Right-clicking and downloading (or 'downloading as') doesn't work - the file simply doesn't appear where you allegedly downloaded it. The only way I find it works is by opening in a new tab (or in-place probably), then saving as 'page source' (not 'web archive') and then typing a file name with the .xml extension. Works fine in Chrome: clicking automatically downloads the file.

Safari does not support the HTML5 download attribute on <a> hyperlinking tags. Therefore it cannot behave the same way chrome does. See http://www.w3schools.com/tags/att_a_download.asp for more details.

Chrome has the default behaviour that when it detects a non HTML file it will assume it is for download, Safari does not make this assumption either which is doubly annoying.
